

DEFINITIONS OF THE GAME

INFIELD FLY RULE:

The rule applies only when there are fewer than two outs, and there is a force play at third base. In these situations, if a fair fly ball is in play, and in the umpire's judgment it is catchable by an infielder with ordinary effort, the umpire shall call "infield fly" (or more often, "infield fly, batter's out"); the batter will be out regardless of whether the ball is actually caught in flight. Runners may advance at their own risk.
